 (Proverbs 3:34-35)

He has been discharged from the hospital and resuming his 3x a week dialysis. We appreciate all the prayers.

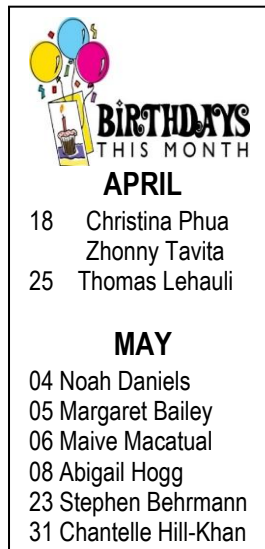
